## A Passion for Student Safety: Nutrition and Education



An Ohio school nutrition director worked several years in the food industry before he was inadvertently introduced to student nutrition.

"I was getting older and wanting to settle down and make a family so finding a more stable job was important," he explained.

"I never really thought about working for the schools until I saw the job open up but I was lucky enough to fall in love with the missions and the job."

I found my passion and love taking care of the students."

Food safety is one of the central planks of his role in taking care of the students at an Ohio public school. The district serves 2,300 pupils at five buildings, including three elementary schools.

He leads a team of 23 employees – all focused on ensuring students have the nutrition they need to foster the best learning environment.

The district is located in one of the more economically challenged parts of Ohio, and many families rely on the school food program as a core part of their meal planning.

"A lot of these kids may not get a good meal at home," he said. "We take a lot of pride in making sure they get a good meal at school."

The string of preventable food losses due to freezer failures made his team well aware of the uncertain nature of the freezers and refrigerators.

"It's all about safety when you talk about feeding these students and the fact is we're only here from 7 to 3 Monday to Friday," he said. "There was just too much time that we didn't know what was going on with our units and that made me nervous."
